Since 1983, the McCloy Fellowship Program of the German Academic Scholarship Foundation has enabled students to pursue a master's degree at the Harvard Kennedy School.

Promoting transatlantic understanding remains as relevant today as it was when the program was founded. Each year, up to six scholarships are awarded to train future leaders for the public sector. The McCloy Scholarship Program fosters a strong transatlantic network and has an active alumni association.

THE SCHOLARSHIP

McCloy's benefit from close support and guidance. Admission to the program also includes admission to the German Academic Scholarship Foundation (Studienstiftung des deutschen Volkes), the largest and oldest organization of its kind in Germany. The McCloy Scholarship is one

of the most generously funded graduate scholarships in Germany. McCloy's receive a monthly stipend, a travel allowance, and a one-off start-up grant. In addition, the scholarship covers a large portion of the tuition fees. At the Harvard Kennedy School, students can choose from various master's programs designed for individuals with different levels of professional experience. The program is funded by Harvard University, the Federal Ministry for Economic Affairs and Energy as administrator of the Special ERP-asset, the Haniel Foundation, the Association for the Promotion of the McCloy Scholarship Program, and the McCloy Fellowship Foundation.

The McCloy Scholarship Program is more than just a scholarship. The German Academic Scholarship Foundation and its partners expect fellows to actively engage in the social and academic life at Harvard.

This includes events such as the German American Conference at Harvard, the McCloy Lecture, balls, and other gatherings that foster German-American understanding. Many alumni

now work in international organizations, public administration, politics, and the private sector. A defining feature of the McCloy Scholarship Program is the strong sense of community across all cohorts. An alumni association maintains the network of more than 250 graduates. Each year, a major gathering is held in Berlin, where current and former McCloyes come together to connect and exchange ideas.

THE MCCLOY PROGRAM

ALL BENEFITS AT ONE GLANCE

- Admission to the German Academic Scholarship Foundation
- Admission to the Haniel Foundation
- Monthly scholarship of \$2,500
- One-off start-up grant of \$500
- Travel grant of \$1,000
- Reduction of tuition fees to 10.000€ per academic year
- Further reduction of remaining tuition fees by special funding from the Association for the Promotion of the McCloy Scholarship Program

APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS

- open for graduates across all disciplines
- Completion of a bachelor's, master's, diploma, or doctoral degree with at least a "good" grade by the time studies begin at the Harvard Kennedy School
- Experience abroad
- Ideally, some initial professional experience
- Strong communication skills and an interest in practice-oriented issues

- The most recent university degree must not date back more than five years from the application deadline (date on the final degree certificate)
- Combination with other scholarships, such as from the DAAD, to reduce the remaining tuition fees. Previous funding by the German Academic Scholarship Foundation is not required.
